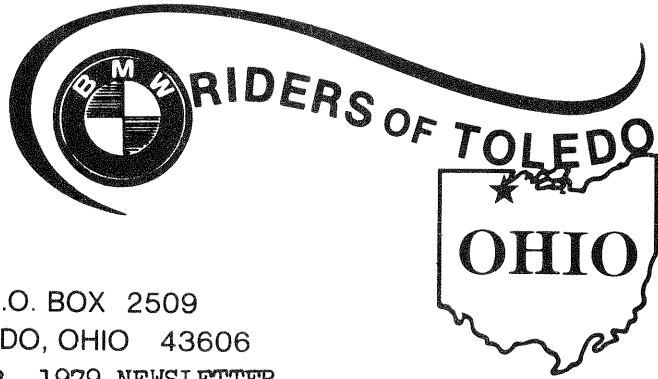

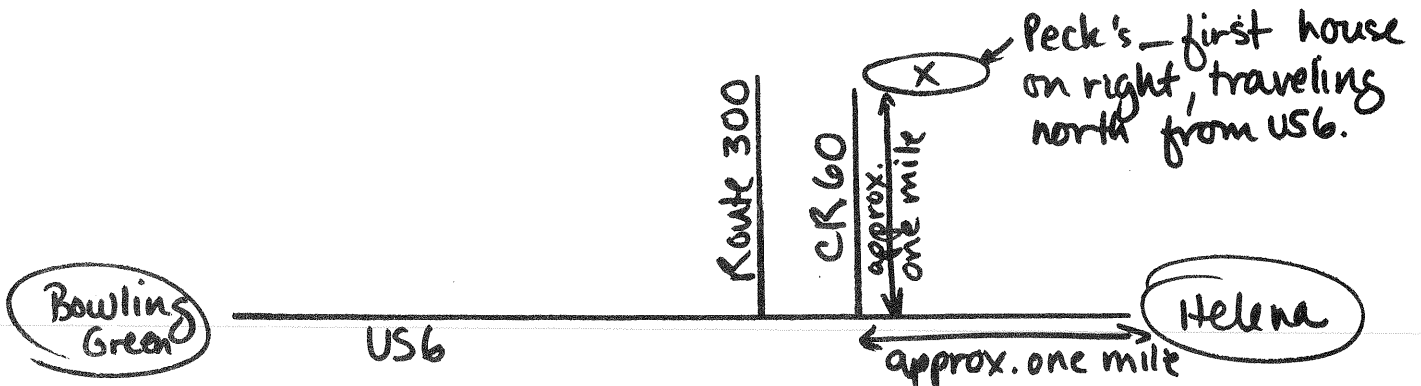
We voted to have the Rally Chair be one of the club officers. We also voted to change the election schedule to: October--nominate, November--elect, December--install new officers.

We agreed not to have a Halloween party this year. However, the "Gibsonburg Group" suggested a hayride, and we agreed to go ahead with this. Details below.

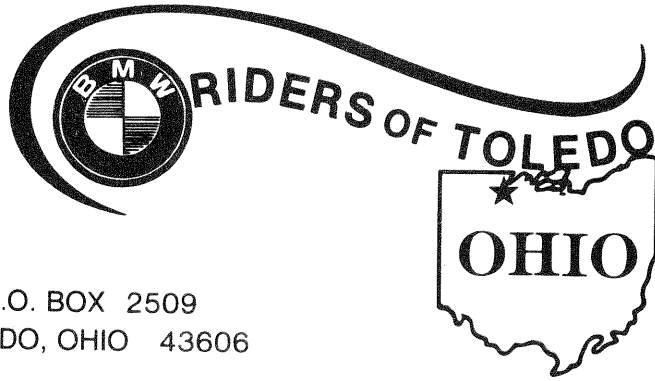
