SPRING TO LIFE Bringing the Beemer Out of Hibernation

You have all heard of the proceedure required to put your steed in storage over the winter. But! Do all of us follow these suggestions? I think not. If you have as many irons in the fire as I do, you leave these important details till tomorrow (a tommorrow which never seems to come, ed.).

Well, now its SPring, and your wondering, will it start or not? Suppose the engine don't run on all cylinders. It could be that one or both valves are stuck open, they do sometimes. The following advice was passed along to me by an aircraft mechanic freind of mine and I pass it along as freely to you.

After determining which cylinder has the stuck valve proceed as follows:

- 1.: Remove the spark plug if not already done, also remove the valve cover on that side of the engine.
- 2.: Lubricate the valve stem and guide of the affected valve with WD-40 or similar lubricant.
- 3.: Rotate the crank to bring the piston to B.D.C. (bottom dead center) at the end of the intake stroke.
- 4.: Take a length (@20 feet)) of cotton clothes line and stuff it into the cylinder through the spark plug hole leaving about a foot hanging out.
- 5.: Move the piston toward T.D.C. (top dead center) on the compression stroke. The rope on top of the piston should push the valve or valves closed
- 6.: Move the piston down and remove the rope. That should do it.
