The surgeons installed a titanium pin and four screws which will be permanent, she has an appointment in one week to have the splint removed after that she will be in a removable splint for a couple of months. The alternative would have been to put her in a cast from hip to toe which she would have been in for 2 to 3 months and then involve much physical therapy. We felt surgery was the clear choice. We want to thank everyone involved for helping us out and for your general concern for our welfare. We fell we indeed have many great friends. ROAD CAPTAIN REPORT


