

Confessions of a Speeder



East Harbor State Park Campground Rules & Information

1. FEES. \$12.00 per site per night without electric

\$17.00 per site per night with electric

\$19.00 per site per night pull-thru site with electric

\$1.00 extra per site per night Holiday weekends

\$1.00 per pet per night (pets are permitted in designated areas only


\$8.00 fee for non-campers to use dump station

\$32.00 per Rent-A-Camp per night (One night nonrefundable deposit required)

Variable - Rent-A-Trailer (\$85 deposit required to confirm reservation)


Golden Buckeye Cards are honored. 50% discount Sunday thru Thursday (Not applicable for RV rentals) 10% discount on Friday and Saturday nights

Disabled Ohio Veterans with proof of eligibility specifying 100% disabled from the Veterans Administration, or ODNR Wildlife hunting/fishing Veteran license, camp free in all Ohio State Parks.



- 3. Camping is on a first come first serve basis. NO RESERVATIONS
- 4. Campers may register for more than one site. Total fees for all sites for all nights rented must be paid in full at the time of registration. If the person registering is a Golden Buckeye Card holder, the GBC discount is only given for one site, regardless of how many sites are being rented. Please post camping receipt on lot marker so that other campers know this site is taken. Three camping units, including dining screen tent are permitted to each site, with maximum combined floor space less than 200 square feet.
- 5. Campers **must** have their name on the registration card in the camp office. (Only <u>one vehicle per site</u> on non-pull through camp sites.)
- 6. Juvenile campers **must** be with their parents, or must provide written permission from their parents, which includes full names and address of the parent or guardian along with a telephone number where they can be reached at all times.
- 7. A maximum of six persons are permitted per campsite: 14 day limit out of a 30 day period.
- 8. Quiet hours start at 10:00pm, (unless posted differently because of programs/holidays...)
- 9. All vehicles and campers must remain on the roads and campsite pads provided for such. Only boat trailers may be parked on the grass. If there is no room on campsite pad, please use the Visitor's parking lot.
- 10. All vehicles must display a valid car pass to enter the campground. One vehicle per site except that two are permitted on pull through sites.
- 11. Shower houses are cleaned daily. Please use toilet buildings when the shower houses are closed.
- 12. Pets are permitted in designated areas only. Pets must be kept on a leash (6ft. maximum length). Please clean up after your pet at all times in all areas of the park. Pets are not permitted in the restrooms, playgrounds, showerhouses, commissary or in Lake Erie at our swimming area, Do not leave your pet unattended even for just an hour. Proof of rabies vaccination, for pets must be available if requested.
- 13. All refuse must be placed in the provided dumpsters. Please, do not leave litter in fire rings or at campsite.
- 14. Intoxicating beverages shall not be overtly or publicly consumed or displayed.
- 15. One picnic table and one fire ring are provided per lot.
- 16. Fires are permitted only in the fire rings. Please do not move the fire rings.
- 17. Metal detectors are permitted on sand beaches only.
- 18. Swimming is prohibited in the ponds. Fishing in the harbor and lake is encouraged!
- 19. Fish cleaning and disposal of fish remains must be done at the fish cleaning station at the boat ramp.
- 20. We appreciate your efforts to keep the area clean and quiet.
- 21. The Nature Center is open for anyone who wishes to visit and everyone is invited to take part in the programs and nature hikes. Schedules listing the times of the programs are posted throughout the campground.
- 22. For the safety of children please observe speed limits.
- 23. Park rules and all State laws are enforced by the Park Officers. Should problems arise, please notify someone at the commissary, Ranger office or dial 911 day or night.
- 24. When leaving the park please drop old registration tag into the "Drop Box" at the exit.






