Old Business



May 20, 2004. I'm doing the usual, packing everything last minute for the spring rally. Mildewed tent (wet from the Sturgis rally earlier in the month). T-shirts, socks, sweat shirts (2), humm. Sleeping bag? Nope, I'm just taking the blanket & air mattress. My cell phone plays out some ridiculous tune. "Dad, just got home from my doctors appointment, yeah, she (doctor) said I should check myself in to the hospital tonight. She wants to induce labor."

Very matter of factly, she's not excited at all about it. She was a week late for delivery. But that's Candi, (daughter). Solid, stable. That's not me. I'm kind of unstable, not solid at all. I'm more pop-n-fresh mushy. Hey, give me a break, I'm turning the big 5.....0...this year.!

"Ok, you got your bag, where's Brad? (the dad) How you getting to the hospital?" I blurted out. "He will be home in a minute, he just left work. I don't have to check in till 7:00 tonight anyway"

My mind was swirling, she was talking about how the inducing thing takes 12 to 15 hours.... Not to rush to the hospital, no big deal. I sort of shifted into excitement mode. I guess I appeared calm on the surface, but underneath I was like the phantom WMDs buried in the sands of time. Well, OK, I was more like a aged cherry

bomb. Possibly volatile, or maybe a fizzling dud. The spring camp out was naturally put on the back burner. I was drawn to St. Luke's by unknown powers. So, I prepared myself for the waiting process.

Outside, The weather was changing. What started out as a warm but beautiful day, turned to some very serious black clouds looming above us? The wind was picking up. I went to the window and watched some people doing the hurricane shuffle in horizontal rain. My ex said that I'd better go check on my bike in the parking lot. "Naw, 600 lbs; it would take a tornado to knock it over", I replied bravely. Right on cue I could hear the weather channel saying that a tornado had been spotted in a near by county. Suddenly, the lights went out. The emergency generators kicked in, and they flicked back on. Then the emergency generators blew. My first thought was, " what about the people on life support?" Surely they have a 12volt battery hooked up to those machines. The nurses rushed into the room and rustled us out into the hallway with the other patients and visitors. I walked my daughter out into the hall where we found some folding chairs. I sat with her, holding her hand. I told her, "this is going to be a powerful baby, she is riding in on a storm. I'm going to call her Storm Rider." My daughter nodded in agreement, but she was on some painkillers that I was wishing I had taken.

5:00 pm, May 21. They had decided to take the baby cesarean. The good news, it would be done in a 'real' operating room. The lights had been restored, for how long we didn't know. Only one person could be in the room as an observer. Brad 'the dad' was naturally elected.

I put down the camcorder. As the consummate artist, I had been producing a docudrama with both my sons as actors, along with a supporting cast of cousins, friends, and obscure relatives. They gave Candi some more morphine and wheeled her away. Birth

is like death, in that it brings out the best and the worse in people around it. The storm, the high emotions, the decision to 'take' the baby had us all in hyper mode. I think they should give the immediate family morphine as well. But no, we waited. This was more like fast food though. It would take one hour.

One hour later someone yelled, "Brad's coming out with the baby!" We rushed down the hallway where we found brad in a wheel chair. "Where's the baby!" A nurse said they would bring her out soon. Apparently Brad had gotten dizzy and couldn't stand up, so they put him in a chair and had wheeled him out of the operating room. I told him to relax, that it was all over, don't try to get up. We ran to the nursery. Aubrey had arrived.

The storm had passed. I'll never forget the moon that night as I got on my bike to go home. It was a perfect crescent. I thanked the moon and the storm for bring Aubrey to us. I felt very small and insignificant as I rode home knowing there are storms bring miracles to this world. I had been lucky enough to watch our miracle ride in on a storm.
