Zen and the art of breaking down

A while back we discussed putting a tech section in the newsletter. Contributed knowledge by members on an array of maintenance issues. An excellent idea. A step-by-step guide on anything from replacing a burned out tail light bulb, to replacing steering head bearings. Written in plain language which may or may not be in your Clymer manual. For example, a published manual is not going to have the following statement in it. If you can squeeze your hand in there, turn the bolt just a hair to release the widget clip. What does the published manual lack? True-life

experience. After all experience is the best teacher.

This is not one of those maintenance articles. I'm not a motorcycle mechanic. I never wanted to do motorcycle maintenance, but through necessity I had to learn it. I get no joy from burning myself, or busting my knuckles while wrenching. I don't see a jumble of multi-colored electrical wires as a challenge. I see it as a pain in the....well you get my point. I'll be the first to admit that I come from a long line of shade tree mechanics. I work proficiently with duct tape, WD40 and baling wire. At the age of 4 I learned the only way to crank a 1955 Oldsmobile was to furiously pump the gas pedal while yelling 'shit fire!' This type of thinking must be expelled from your mind when dealing with German machinery. There is a precise procedure for all maintenance issues. Even for something as simple as mounting a rear tire.

A couple of weeks ago I was riding along when my bike began shaking violently. "Ah, a flat tire" I thought. I pulled in a park to examine my tires. Nope, tires are good. I put the K bike on the center stand and moved the back wheel. It was loose all right. I could see the center lug bolt and turn it with my fingers. Naturally, my tool kit was back at my garage. There was an odd chance that a car lug wrench might fit my lug bolt. A very odd chance. As I approached several women joggers getting out of their cars, it became clear that borrowing a lug wrench might be difficult. The women joggers smiled and ran from me. After 4 of these encounters I felt like screaming, 'I'm the reincarnate of Ted Bundy. I must hold your lug wrench in my perverted little hands!'. Finally, a man in a ford pick up loaned me his lug wrench. The wrench was about a 1/2 size to big for the lug bolt, but it did turn the bolt. At least the back wheel didn't wobble anymore. My adventure resumed!

Starting out back on the road, the bike continued to shake and wobble. Then, something went pop and the bike rode as if

I was just pulling out of the show room floor. No wobble, wiggle or shake. However, I knew from past misadventures not to get over confident, so I kept my speed low. I was only a mile or so from my house. With a smile and a prayer I might make it home.

Murphy's law was in full swing as I turned on to street I live on. Another resounding pop as my last lug bolt snapped. Bang! The bike simply sat down. I had a ridiculous vision in my head of a donkey sitting on his hindquarters braying. An insane giggle bubbled up from the pit of my stomach as I shut the bike off. To add insult to injury, my back wheel zoomed past me. What do you say to your back tire as it passes you? "Go to the garage! I'll be there in a little while!" The wheel went ½ block then wobbled to the curb for a rest.

My neighbor Steve and I devised a plan to use a floor jack under my trailer hitch to lift and push the bike the remaining block to my garage. We huffed and puffed the Bismarck to the garage. Steve guiding from the rear like a ship's rudder, as I push from the handlebars. Back to safe harbor. We docked her on the center stand. Three of the bolts holding the wheel on had broken off in the hub. The other 2 had apparently backed themselves out and vanished. I had to drill out the broken bolts and replace all 5 of them.

A few days latter at the Octoberfest club meeting, several of us were speculating as to why the wheel became loose. The general conscience was that I might have over tightened the lug bolts stretching the threads. Did I use a torque wrench? Of course not! My way is to tighten the bolt as hard as I can with my arm, then hit the wrench twice with a hammer. You know, like you would on a 1986 Buick. Was this the reason for the wheel coming off? Perhaps. Its one of a multitude of explanations. I file such logical explanations away with their own kind. Explanations like, " it was just a weather balloon." Its much more romantic to look at other possible reasons. My friend Sonja

simply put it best, "bad ju ju". You might also say that adversity is only given to those strong enough to handle it. That makes a lovely refrigerator magnet, but if you told me that 100 miles from home broke down on the side of the road. I might strike you on the helmet with a tire iron. These are the reasons that I'm in the club. Because 60 heads are better than one. Because left to my own devices.... I went home from the meeting, dusted off my torque wrench, and set the bolts to specs. Not because I buy the whole stretching bolt theory, even though it is in the realm of possibilities. I did it just to be on the safe side.


