We top the mountain and pull off at the Sunteetlah overlook. Keep in mind we're 5,377 feet up, 30 miles from anything and it's 10:30 in the morning. We get off to get some ego shots of Gary running the curves. As we're loading the bike back up a woman, and her friend with baby, driving a pickup pulls up with her husband following behind on bike. The SV Riders are setting up a tent for a poker run. We exchange pleasantries and ATTEMPT to leave... only to find WE HAVE A FLAT! The second woman's husband pulls in. Kendra was kind of enough to take Gary and wheel to Robbinsville to fix the tire. Anastasia and Derrick along with 2 1/2 month old baby Lucas stay on the mountain with me. Plenty of people, mostly Harley riders, pulled over in this time to check the bike out. Some pull up in front and leave while others pull up, get off, walk around it puzzled only sniffing to make sure it was still alive then off they go. One lone Beemer rider pulls up and asks what was wrong and whether we needed help and if we were going to the rally. He then asked if we had any food to which I replied some chips and water. 7 days, 7 States, 2224 miles.


